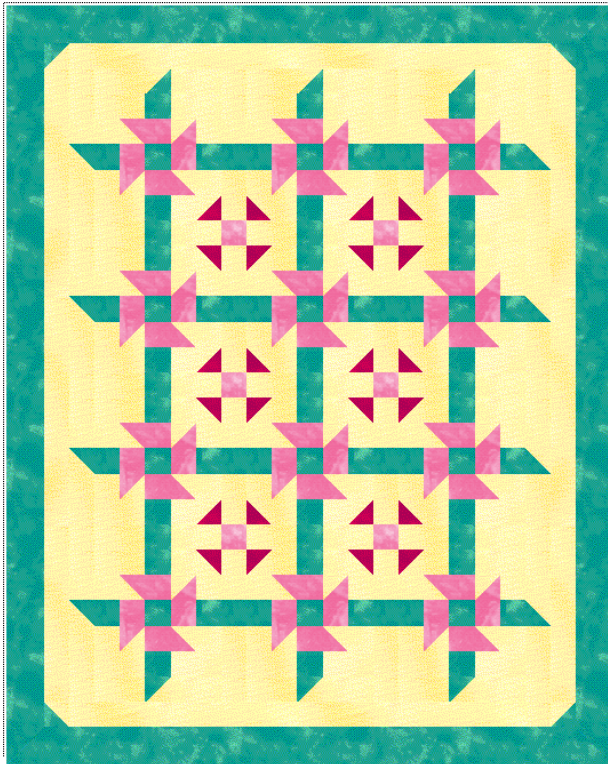






Buttons and Bows – 48” x 60”

A cute throw or toddler quilt that goes together quickly. The pieced sashing gives the appearance of the “bows” hanging on a ribbon.

Block Size: 10”



	Fabric 1 – 2-1/4 yards
	Fabric 2 – 1/2 yard
	Fabric 3 – 1-1/4 yard
	Fabric 4 – 1/4 yard
Binding – 5/8 yard	

Cutting Directions:

Fabric #1:

Cut 4 – 4-1/2” strips. (E)

Cut 3 – 2-7/8” strips. Cut these into 36 – 2-7/8” squares.

Label 24 of these as (A).

Label 12 of these as (C).

Cut 1 – 4-7/8” strip. Cut this into 2 – 4-7/8” squares. (H). **

**From the leftovers, cut 4 – 2-1/2” squares. (G)

Cut 2 – 4-1/2” strips. Cut these into 18 – 2-1/2” x 4-1/2” rectangles.** (O)

** From the leftovers, cut 8 – 4-1/2” squares. (R)

Cut 4 – 4-1/2” strips. Cut these into 10 – 4-1/2” x 10-1/2” rectangles. (Q)

Cut 5 – 2-1/2” strips. (S)

Fabric #2:

Cut 4 – 2-1/2” strips. Cut these into 54 – 2-1/2” squares.

Label 48 of these as (I).

Label 6 of these as (N).
 Cut 2 – 2-7/8” strips. Cut these into 24 – 2-7/8” squares. (B)

Fabric #3:

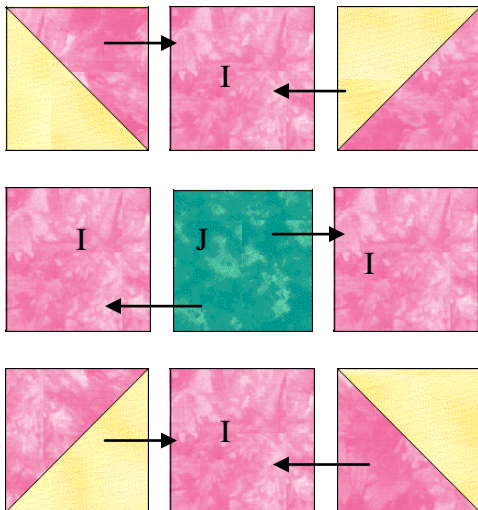
Cut 2 – 2-1/2” strips. (F)
 Cut 1 – 2-1/2” strips. Cut these into 16 – 2-1/2” squares. (J)
 Cut 1 – 4-7/8” strip. Cut this into 2 – 4-7/8” squares. (L)
 Cut 1 – 2-1/2” strips. Cut this into 14 – 2-1/2” squares. (K)
 Cut 6 – 3-1/2” strips for the outer border. (M)
 Cut 3 – 2-1/2” strips. (P)

Fabric #4:

Cut 1 – 2-7/8” strip. Cut this into 12 – 2-7/8” squares. (D)

Block Construction:

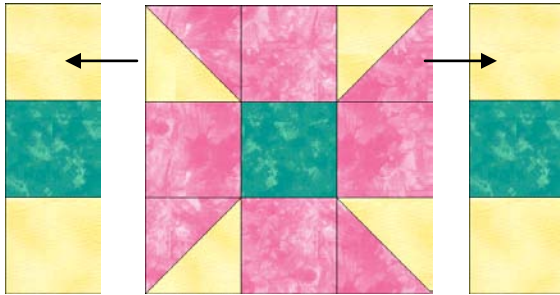
- Using the 24 - 2-7/8” squares of Fabrics 1 (A) and 2 (B), create 48 Half Square Triangles. Square up to 2-1/2 if needed.
- Using the 12 – 2-7/8” squares of Fabrics 1 (C) and 4 (D), create 24 Half Square Triangles. Square up to 2-1/2” if needed.
- Using the half square triangles, the 2-1/2” squares of Fabric 2 (I) and the 2-1/2” squares of Fabric 3 (J), create the center of the blocks as shown below. Pay careful attention to the location of the half square triangles. Make 12 centers.



- Sew 2 – 2-1/2” strips of Fabric 1 (S) to 1 – 2-1/2” strip of Fabric 3 (P). Make 2-1/2 sets. Cut them into 34 – 2-1/2” segments.



5. Add a strip from step 4 to each side of the 12 centers from Step 4.



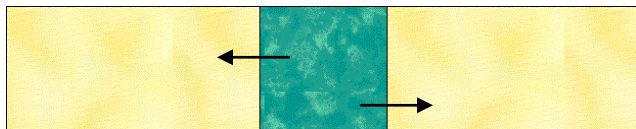
6. Sew 2 – 4-1/2” strips of Fabric 1 (E) to 1 – 2-1/2” strip of Fabric 3 (F). Make 2 sets. Cut them into 27 – 2-1/2” segments. Ten of these will be used for blocks and 17 will be used for the sashing.



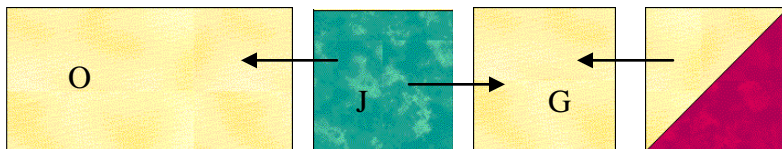
For approximately 25” of one strip, press the seam allowances toward the Fabric 1 strips. From this portion, cut 10 segments for the blocks.

For the remainder of that strip and for the second strip, press the seam allowances towards the Fabric 3 strip. From this portion cut 17 segments that will be used for the sashing.

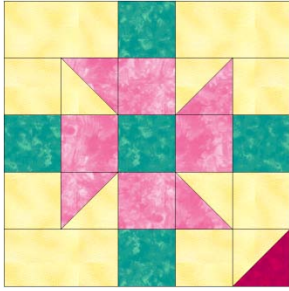
7. For Block A and Block B, add the following top row (from step #6):



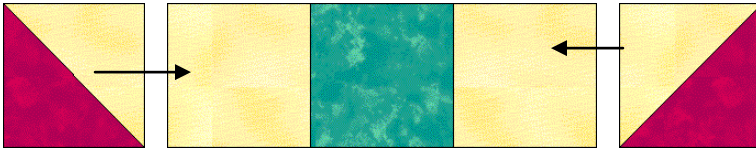
8. For Block A, add the following bottom row:



Block A - Make 4

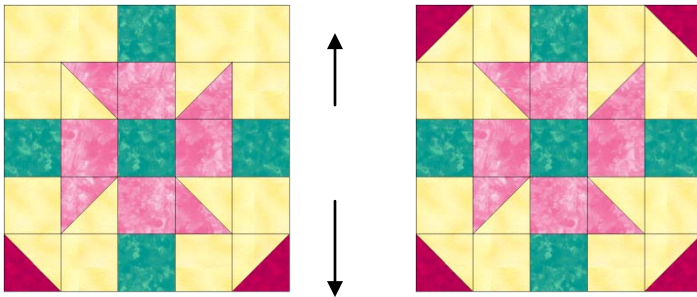


9. Sew a half square triangle from step #2 to each end a strip from step #4. Add this row to the bottom of Block B, and to the top and bottom of Block C.



Block B – Make 6

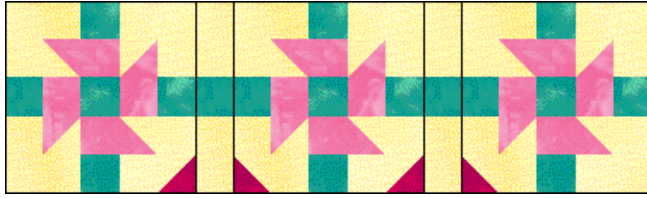
Block C – Make 2



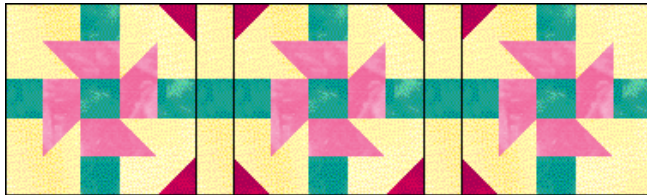
10. The blocks will be set together in rows, with the sashing strips from Step 6, as follows:

A	B	A
B	C	B
B	C	B
A	B	A

Rows 1 and 4:



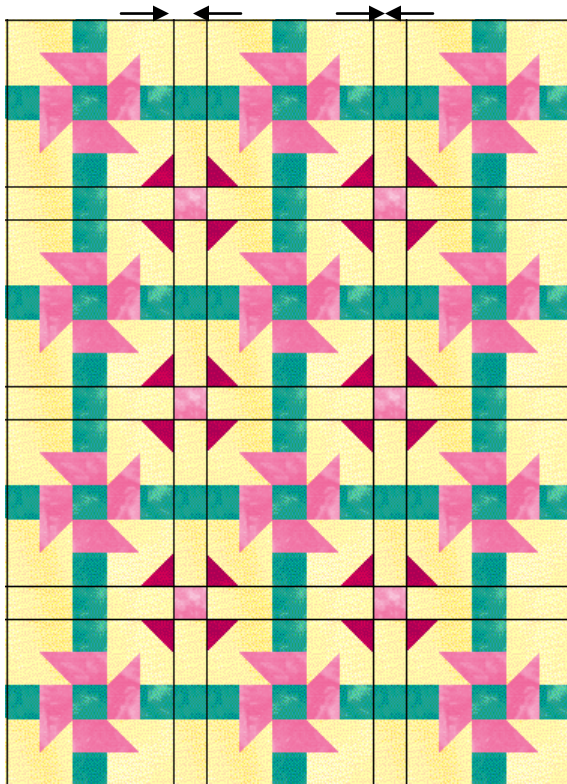
Rows 2 and 3:



11. Add a 2-1/2" square of Fabric 2 (N) to the sashing strips from Step 6 to create 3 sashing rows.



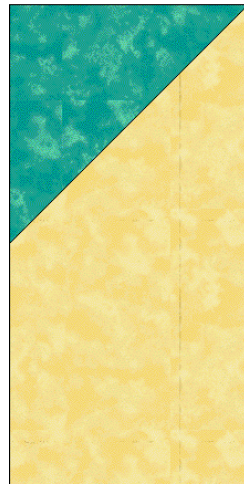
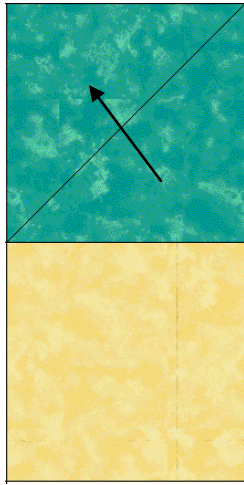
12. Set the rows together with the sashing strips.



Before adding borders, the top will measure 34-1/2" x 46-1/2", including seam allowances.

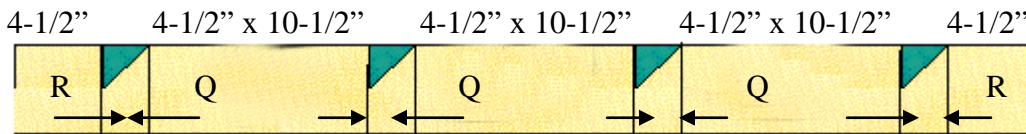
13. For the pieced border, use the 14 - 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles of Fabric 1 (O), and the 14 - 2-1/2" squares of Fabric 3 (K). Draw a diagonal line across the 2-1/2" squares. Lay a

square on top of the of the Fabric 1 rectangle (O) as shown. Sew on the drawn line to create the following units. Flip the corner towards the outside and press.



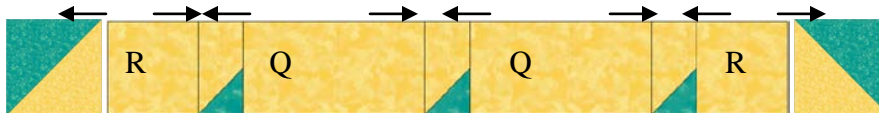
Create 14 of these “half flying geese” units.

14. Combine 4 of these units with 3 – 4-1/2” x 10-1/2” rectangles of Fabric 1 (Q). Add a 4-1/2” square of Fabric 1 (R) to each end. Make two of these units for the left and right sides of the top. Add to the top. Press the seam allowance away from the border.



15. For the top and bottom borders, use 3 of the half flying geese units, 2 of the 4-1/2” x 10-1/2” rectangles of Fabric 1 (Q), and 2 of the 4-1/2” squares of Fabric 1 (R) .

Create Half Square Triangles using the 2 – 4-7/8” squares of Fabrics 1 (H) and 3 (L). Square the four HST’s to 4-1/2”. These are for the corners of this border. Add one of these HST’s to each side of the top and bottom border. Make two of these units for the top and bottom. Add the borders to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press the seam allowance away from the border.



Join the 3-1/2” strips of Fabric 3 (M) to form the outer border. There is sufficient fabric to miter the corners if you wish. If not, add the side borders, press, square the corners. Then add the top and bottom borders.

Quilt as desired. Bind and label.
